Professor Branka Dimitrijević, Department of Architecture, University of Strathclyde, Glasgow, Scotland

Branka Dimitrijević is a Professor of Architecture at the Department of Architecture, University of Strathclyde in Glasgow. She has a BSc in Architecture and Urban Planning, an MSc in Revitalization of Architectural and Urban Heritage and a PhD in History of Architecture. Her international professional experience and research include history of architecture, sustainable architectural design, urban planning and revitalization of architectural and urban heritage. Since 2000, she has directed multi-institutional knowledge transfer projects between academia and industry including CIC Start Online (www.cicstart.org) and Mainstreaming Innovation (www.mainstreaminginnovation.org) which have attracted over 3,200 members nationally and internationally. Focus of these two projects respectively was on sustainable building design and refurbishment, and integration of low carbon infrastructures into the built environment. Since 2005, Branka has been a Visiting Professor at a PhD course at the Polytechnic University of Bari, Italy. Branka collaborated with the Institute of Architecture and Urbanism of Serbia (IAUS) on the research on the influence of climate change on urban planning in 2011-2015. She was also a guest lecturer at the University of Basilicata, Italy, and has published research undertaken in collaboration with the academics of this institution in 2011.

In 2002-2005, Branka was a Co-ordinator of the CIB W102 Knowledge and Information Management in Building. She was a board member of Scottish Sustainable Development Forum in 2010-2013 and of the Architecture and Design Scotland (2010-2014) and currently a member of 2020 Climate Group Scotland. Branka has acted as a reviewer of research outputs of Italian academics, research proposals in Denmark and Serbia, and project proposals submitted to Innovate UK and Nesta in the United Kingdom. She is a member of the Editorial Advisory Board of the Journal on Cultural Heritage Management and Sustainable Development (Emerald Group), Architecture i Urbanizam (IAUS) and International Journal of Architectural Research (ArchNet). Branka acts as a referee for papers submitted to Buildings, Systems, Land Use Policy, International Journal for Sustainable Built Environment, Construction and Building Materials, Sustainable Cities and Society, Energy Policy, Engineering Sustainability, Facilities, Spatium, and Journal of Clinical Research and Governance
