Professor Jacqueline Glass FCIQB FCABE is Chair in Architecture and Sustainable Construction, in the School of Architecture, Building and Civil Engineering at Loughborough University. Her research portfolio spans responsible sourcing, life-cycle assessment, sustainability standards, organisational values and resource efficiency, within the construction sector. As a multi-disciplinary, close-to-industry researcher, she has published over 150 papers, and supervised more than 20 doctoral students to completion since starting her academic career in 1998. With many years' experience as a consultant in the construction products industry, she has been commissioned to lead strategic sustainability projects in the UK, Europe and North America for corporate, government and international bodies. Jacqui is the founder of APRES, the responsible and ethical sourcing community, which is now part of Constructing Excellence at BRE (<http://apres.bre.co.uk/>).

She has won industry awards for her pioneering work on construction supply chains, and from 2014-2017 was Chair of the Horizon Group of the Supply Chain School. Jacqui has been a member of several BSI committees relating to organisational sustainability, circular economy and materials. She is now Chair of the BSI Committee SDS/3 Sustainable Consumption and Production, and a member of the Editorial Board of the CIOB's Construction Manager magazine. Jacqui has been Director of the Centre for Innovative and Collaborative Construction Engineering at Loughborough University since 2015, and was previously Associate Dean for Enterprise.
