Professor René Kemp, Innovation and Sustainable Development, ICIS Research Institute, Maastricht University and Professorial Fellow, UNU-MERIT (United Nations University and Maastricht University), The Netherlands

Rene is an innovation researcher with a background in economics and an interest in policy, history, societal change, theory and research methodology. He is an expert of sustainability transitions, governance for sustainable development, policy evaluation, the study of eco-innovation and resource efficiency with domain expertise in the energy, automobility, waste and eco-industry sectors. Rene has also worked on social innovation and urban labs. As a professor of innovation and sustainable development he has tried to do socially relevant research and offer policy advice to create a better world. His experiences with policy dialogue and knowledge of the sociology of knowledge helped him to appreciate the ways in which facts and values are intertwined.

Rene has also worked at different universities and research institutes as a payroll researcher and visiting researcher: IPTS in Sevilla (Spain), STEP in Oslo (Norway), University of Twente in Enschede, TNO in Delft and Erasmus University in Rotterdam (The Netherlands), Harvard University in the US, CIRUS in Switzerland and the EIRC in Hobart, Australia. He has consulted for the OECD and UNIDO and advised the European Commission on the RTD implications of climate change and acted as a reviewer of research proposals many times. For the Environment Council, Rene wrote a policy note on eco-efficient innovation in 2004, which fed into the Council's conclusions and pioneered new approaches for policy such as Strategic Niche Management and Transition Management, which became the topic of worldwide attention.
