Jade's research explores the connection between digital fashion, identity and consumer behaviour. Her work lie in sustainable fashion & innovation; she is an advocate of using tech for good and is keen to understand the implications of emerging technologies for future fashion consumers. A former fashion model of 15 years, she uses her experience in the industry to apply a human lens to technologies, asking questions in regards to ethics, identity and sustainable consumption within virtual worlds.
