Do Not Bin It – We May Fix It

- Lover (pronounced like Dover)
 is a small village in Wiltshire,
 close to the border with
 Hampshire.
- It is about 7.5 miles southeast of Salisbury.
- It has a population of around 2,800 people
- Lover residents decorate their village with hearts and run a pop-up Post Office for two weeks before Valentine's Day.
- They run the 'Worlds Biggest' Village Garage Sale in April





How did we start?



- In 2018, Paul Bromage and Maurice Caustick got to know each other as part of a local group of people who were learning how to use computers.
- They both had something in common. They both wanted to do more to help the local community.
- They looked around on the Internet for something that would challenge them and discovered the Mens Shed organisation.
- They searched again after being challenged by the ladies in the group, and they discovered the **Repair** Café Organisation.
- They founded the Lover Repair Café in March 2019



Who are Lover Repair Café?



Lover Repair Café:

- Meets every Wednesday and Friday morning in the Village Hall.
- Operate a walk-in service no pre-booking required.
- Have around fifty volunteer repairers some of whom can only work from home.
- Repairers include qualified professionals and unqualified helpers who learn new skills
- Dismantles unrepairable items into metals, plastics, electronics for recycling
- Have clients in Wiltshire, Hampshire, Dorset and farther afield

We repair clothes, furniture, electrical appliances, clocks, bicycles, crockery, tools, toys – and more!

And we have a saying: DO NOT BIN IT – WE MAY FIX IT!



Who are Lover Repair Café?



Instead, we worked throughout the Pandemic by changing how we operate.

We modelled ourselves more on **The Repair Shop** TV show where people drop off their jobs, we repair them and then they collect them.

Our clients asked us to start taking donations for the NHS

We believe we were the only Repair Café in the UK to operate throughout Covid.

Job Statistics

Do Not Bin It – We May Fix II

Since starting in 2019:

- We've held 360 events
- We have over 940 clients
- We have completed 4,600 jobs.
- Of those, **3,800** were successful repairs that's **83%**
- On average, we take 90 jobs a month.
- We have donated over £26,000 to charity

Using the Farnham Repair Café calculation model:

- We've diverted 14 tonnes from landfill
- We've saved 154 tonnes of CO2e
- We have potentially saved our community over £300,000






Job Statistics

What sort of jobs do we do?


We class our jobs into Categories.
The full list of categories is

Electrical, Mechanical, Woodwork, General Works, Computing, Textiles, Ceramic/Glass, Metalwork, Toy Repair, Jewellery, Advice, Bicycles



How successful are we?

Some types of jobs are more successful than others. For example, Woodworking jobs are almost 100% successful, while we are only 81% successful with electrical repairs – and only 78% successful with technology (mainly printers).

Lover Repair Café And this isn't the whole story.

- ► The Café meets twice a week and provides a regular social focus for the community, where visitors can come along for a coffee, a cake and a chat.
- It's also there for the Repairers, who value the friendship, support and social side in addition to the challenges posed by the variety of repairs that come through the door.
- Many visitors have commented on how positive the atmosphere is during our meetings – creating a real sense of community.
